Here in Oregon we believe that there is a bipartisan majority in congress that supports a pathway to citizenship for 11 million undocumented immigrants in the United States today. **America deserves a vote on immigration reform with a path to citizenship.** Right now, if House leaders scheduled a vote on reform with a new roadmap to citizenship, a bipartisan majority of members in the House would vote for it. Part of democracy is letting the majority will express itself. It's up to House Republican leaders – Speaker Boehner, Majority Leader Cantor, and Majority Whip McCarthy – to do just that.

The time is now for a real solution: reform with citizenship. We want nothing less than an inclusive path to initial immigration status and an achievable path to eventual citizenship for 11 million undocumented immigrants in America. Some are suggesting that we offer undocumented immigrants work permits, but not full citizenship. That approach would relegate millions of people to a permanent underclass. Others are suggesting that Congress should address the status of immigrant youth only, and leave the rest of the 11 million aside. But we're mobilizing for all 11 million. In fact, DREAMers have spoken out strongly against a policy that legalizes them but deports their parents. We don't want any more families to be separated. We don't want half-measures that don't meet the challenge of getting it right once and for all. We are fighting for every one of the 11 million aspiring Americans. Sincerely,
